1) WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

2) DATA SHARING

3) 2019 COMMUNITY HEALTH ASSESSMENT UPDATE

- The Community Health Assessment (CHA) steers the focus of the CHIP. HHSA is collaborating with the local hospital this year to perform a single community health needs assessment, which will result in a single report. Sutter and Dignity have hired a consultant to handle parts of the assessment such as key informant interviews and focus groups, with HHSA handling the survey and providing the public health perspective.
- The consultants will be hosting several focus groups, including one specifically for Healthy Yolo participants.
- The Health Status Survey will be opened through July. It is instrumental to have individuals complete the survey to share their perspective.
- Haydee Dabritz, along with a team of interns, have been working diligently in getting the survey distributed as well as inputting and analyzing data.
- Once the survey is closed and the data has been analyzed, the consultants will begin drafting the report. The report should be near the end of the calendar year.
- The group brainstormed additional partners to help distribute the survey:
 - There is a food bank in Clarksburg.
 - Waiting for results from Winters Cr Center.
 - Have been at the food bank.
 - Kellymarie suggested 4th and Hope.

4) REVIEWED HEALTH OUTCOMES

- The group reviewed the current health outcomes. Haydee shared that a request for the 2017 hospital data has been submitted and should be available in October or November.

5) ANNOUNCEMENTS, UPDATES & NETWORKING

- The City of Winters is applying to be an age-friendly community. The City of West Sacramento has already applied. This is a five-year process and identifies eight domains that make an age-friendly community. The first two years are spent on assessment and developing a plan.
- West Sacramento has identified safety and transportation as two of their priorities in their age-friendly community plan. For example, the time for crosswalks has been increased. In addition, there is a new on demand ride share van.
