ORDINANCE NO. 1113

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(An Ordinance Amending the Yolo County Code Relating to Quorum Requirements for the Park, Recreation and Wildlife Advisory Committee)

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo, State of California, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 2-2.1406 of Chapter 1 of Title 2 of Article 14 of the Yolo County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2-2.1406. Meetings: Quorum.

The Park, Recreation, and Wildlife Advisory Committee shall meet on call of the Chairperson with at least one (1) week's written notice of such meeting. A quorum to conduct a meeting shall consist of one-half plus one of the current membership of the Committee. The County Clerk-Recorder shall be notified of the date and time of each meeting of the Committee.

SECTION 2. Effective Date/Publication.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after its passage, and prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its adoption, it shall be published once in The Daily Democrat, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Yolo.

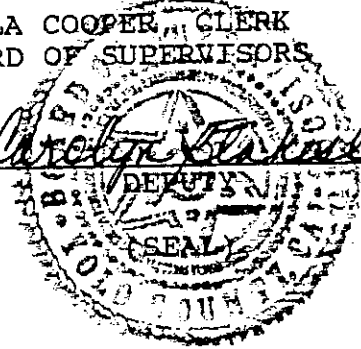

To act in an capacity to the Board of Supervisors and the Director of Parks, Museum and Grounds. To consider the needs of the county with respect to the development of a regional park system . To study and review plans and programs for the long range development of a county park master plan. To consider proposals or request submitted by individual citizens or groups and to make such recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the County Administrative Officer as may be necessary and desirable.

~~County employees shall apply to Mental Health Advisory Board members, including prior approval by the County Administrative Officer for all overnight travel. Sec. 2-2.1309. Subcommittees.

The Mental Health Advisory Board may appoint such subcommittees as it deems appropriate and necessary for the fulfillment of its duties and responsibilities. (§ 1, Ord. 831, eff. March 8, 1979)

Article 14. Park and Recreation Advisory Committee

Sec. 2-2.1401. Created.

There is hereby created in the County a committee to be known as the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee. (§ 1, Res. 67-14)

Sec. 2-2.1402. Membership.

The Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall consist of ten (10) members appointed by the Board, and each Supervisor shall recommend and nominate two (2) private citizens from the supervisory district represented by the Supervisor. One member of the Board and the County Administrative Officer shall be ex officio members of the Committee. (§ III, Res. 67-14)

Sec. 2-2.1403. Membership: Terms.

The members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. (§ IV, Res. 67-14)

Sec. 2-2.1404. Membership: Organization.

At the first meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee, the members shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman to hold office for a twelve (12) month term, and at each March meeting thereafter the members shall elect the officers for the next succeeding twelve (12) month

term. The Park Director, who shall not be a member of the Committee, shall be secretary of the Committee. (§ V, Res. 67-14)

Sec. 2-2.1405. Membership: Expense reimbursements.

Members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall receive reimbursements for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties outside the boundaries of the County. (§ VIII, Res. 67-14)

Sec. 2-2.1406. Meetings: Quorum.

The first regular meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall be held in the month of March, 1967, and thereafter shall meet on call of the chairman with at least one week's written notice of such meeting. A quorum to conduct a meeting shall consist of six (6) members of the Committee. The County Clerk-Recorder shall be notified of the date and time of each meeting of the Committee.

Sec. 2-2.1407. Meetings: Minutes.

A copy of the minutes of each meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall be filed with the Clerk of the Board and the County Executive.
(§ VII, Res. 67-14)

Sec. 2-2.1408. Duties.

The duties and responsibilities of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall be as follows:

- (a) To act in an advisory capacity to the Board and the Director of Parks;
- (b) To consider the needs of the County with respect to the development of a regional park system;
- (c) To study and review plans and programs for the long-range development of a County park master plan;
- (d) To consider proposals or requests submitted by individual citizens or groups; and
- (e) To make such recommendations to the Board and the County Executive as may be necessary and desirable.

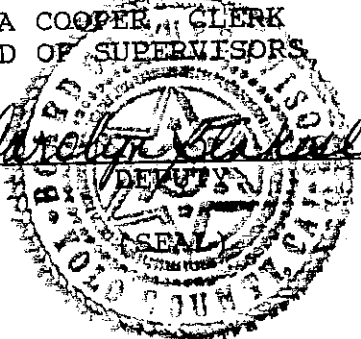

(An Ordinance to Amend Article 14 of Chapter 2 of Title 2
of the Yolo County Code to Create the
Park, Recreation, and Wildlife Advisory Committee)

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo, State of
California, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the
Yolo County Code is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Section 2-2.1401 of Article 14 of Chapter 2
of Title 2 of the Yolo County Code is hereby amended to read as
follows:

Section 2-2.1401. Created.

The Park and Recreation Advisory Committee shall henceforth
be known as the Park, Recreation, and Wildlife Advisory
Committee.

SECTION 3. Section 2-2.1402 of Article 14 of Chapter 2
of Title 2 of the Yolo County Code is hereby amended to read as
follows:

SECTION 2-2.1402. Membership.

The Park, Recreation, and Wildlife Advisory Committee shall
consist of ten (10) members appointed by the Board, and each
Supervisor shall recommend and nominate two (2) private citizens
from the supervisorial district represented by the Supervisor.
One (1) member of the Board and the County Administrative Officer
shall be ex-officio members of the Committee. The members of the
Park and Recreation Advisory Committee disbanded by this ordinance

1 shall comprise the initial membership of the Park, Recreation,
2 and Wildlife Committee.

3 SECTION 4. Section 2-2.1403 of Article 14 of Chapter 2
4 of Title 2 of the Yolo County Code is hereby amended to read as

10 SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE/PUBLICATION.

11 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30)
12 days after its passage, and prior to the expiration of
13 fifteen (15) days after its passage, this ordinance shall be
14 published once in The Daily Democrat, a newspaper of
15 general circulation, printed and published in the County of Yolo.

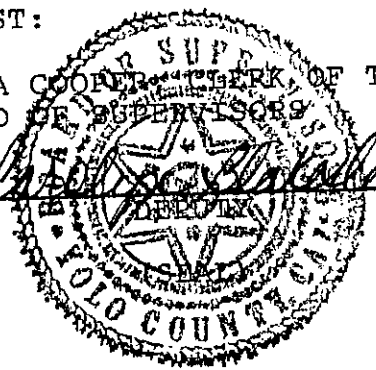

Article 6. Fish and Game Advisory Committee**Sec. 2-2.601. Created.**

A committee is hereby created in the County to be known as the Fish and Game Advisory Committee.

(§ 1, Ord. 454)

Sec. 2-2.602. Membership.

The Fish and Game Advisory Committee shall consist of five (5) members who shall serve without compensation. Each member of the Board shall nominate one member to the Committee, and all nominations shall be subject to the approval of the Board. A majority vote of the Board shall be sufficient to approve any nomination to the Committee.

(§§ 1 and 2, Ord. 454)

Sec. 2-2.603. Membership: Terms.

The term of office of each member of the Fish and Game Advisory Committee shall be four (4) years and until his successor is appointed, except that the terms of the members first appointed shall be as follows:

- (a) Two (2) members shall serve two (2) years;
 - (b) Three (3) members shall serve four (4) years; and
 - (c) Each subsequent appointment shall be for the term of four (4) years.
- (§ 3, Ord. 454)

Sec. 2-2.604. Membership: Organization.

Within ten (10) days after the appointment of the Fish and Game Advisory Committee, it shall meet and organize by selecting one of its members chairman and one member secretary, and classify themselves by lot as to their respective terms of office as provided in Section 2-2.603 of this article.

Sec. 2-2.605. Membership: Removal.

Any member of the Fish and Game Advisory Committee may be removed at any time by a majority vote of the Board.

Sec. 2-2.606. Duties.

It shall be the duty and responsibility of the Fish and Game Advisory Committee to advise and recommend the most economical and efficient method for the expenditure of fish and game propagation funds and upon any other matter relating to the conservation and propagation of fish and game in the County.

Article 7. Health Professional Utilization Review Committee

(Sections 2-2.701 through 2-2.703, codified from Resolution No. 66-80, repealed by Ordinance No. 687, effective October 24, 1973)

Article 8. Highway Transportation Advisory Committee

(Sections 2-2.801 through 2-2.805, codified from Resolution No. 64-40, repealed by Ordinance No. 716, effective February 19, 1975)

Article 9. Historical Advisory Committee***Sec. 2-2.901. Created.**

There is hereby created the Yolo County Historical Advisory Committee.

(§ 1, Ord. 923, eff. November 12, 1981)

Sec. 2-2.902. Membership.

The membership of the Historical Advisory Committee shall consist of fifteen (15) rotating members, three (3) members from each supervisorial district, appointed by the Board.

Sec. 2-2.903. Membership: Terms.

(a) The initial terms of the members of the Historical Advisory Committee shall be as follows:
